



Multidisciplinary Service Delivery Provider Statement

At K1ds Count Therapy, we are committed to providing high-quality, evidence-based therapeutic services that support the whole child and meet the highest standards of clinical ethics and regulatory compliance. Our multidisciplinary team delivers a range of research-supported treatments, including Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, and mental health therapy. At K1ds Count Therapy, we only provide evidence-based pediatric therapy services.

The frequency and duration of service is contingent upon the results of the initial evaluation and the impending recommendation of the responsible therapist or professional. K1ds Count Therapy has promised no specific outcomes as to the services provided at this facility.

Commitment to Evidence-Based Practice

All services offered by our organization are grounded in science, supported by current research, and delivered by professionals who are trained and credentialed in their respective fields. We do not provide alternative or non-evidence-based treatments.

Clear Separation of ABA and Other Clinical Services

When a child receives multiple types of therapy through our organization, each service is delivered independently to maintain clinical integrity.

- Non-behavior analytic services—such as Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, or Mental Health Therapy—are never delivered during an ABA session.
- These services are not provided by ABA staff unless those individuals also hold the appropriate training, license, or credential required for that additional discipline.
- Service timelines, goals, documentation, and billing for each discipline are kept separate to ensure clarity and compliance.

Dually-Credentialed Providers

Some team members may hold dual credentials (e.g., BCBA + SLP, BCBA + OT, BCBA + LCSW). When these clinicians provide services outside of ABA:

- They do so under the scope of the other credential, not under their ABA certification.
- They communicate this clearly to families, caregivers, and payors.
- All written documentation—including treatment plans, progress notes, session summaries, and correspondence—explicitly identifies which service is being delivered.
- A clear service-type disclaimer is included to distinguish these services from ABA.
 - o Example disclaimer: “The services provided during this session are Speech Therapy services, not Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). These services are administered under my credential as a licensed Speech-Language Pathologist.”
